





## Year 1 English Yearly Overview

Reading comprehension focus	<p><b>Visualise</b> what they have been reading.</p>	<p><b>Make predictions</b> based on clues such as pictures, illustrations, titles.</p> <p>Discuss <b>reasons</b> why things happen in the texts they read or are read to them.</p>	<p><b>Ask questions</b> about aspects of a text they don't understand.</p> <p><b>Explain</b> the meaning of the words they meet in a text.</p>	<p><b>Scan</b> the text to locate specific information – using titles, labels.</p> <p>Discuss and <b>compare</b> events or topics they have read about or have listened to.</p>	<p><b>Note</b> some of the features of <b>non-fiction</b> texts.</p> <p><b>Find information</b> in a text about an event, character or topic.</p>	<p><b>Skim</b> read to gain an overview of a page/text.</p> <p><b>Explore</b> the effects of patterns of language and repeated words and phrases.</p>

Writing composition focus	<p><b>Plan writing:</b> Say out loud what they are going to write about.</p>	<p><b>Drafting and writing:</b> Compose a sentence orally before writing.</p>	<p>Sequence <b>sentences</b> to form short narratives.</p>	<p><b>Re-read</b> what they have written to check that it makes sense.</p>	<p><b>Discuss</b> what they have written with the teacher or other pupils.</p>	<p><b>Read aloud</b> their writing clearly enough to be heard by their peers and the teacher.</p>
Speaking and Listening focus	<p>Speak <b>audibly</b> and <b>intelligibly</b>.</p>	<p><b>Listen attentively</b> making relevant observations.</p>	<p>Independently <b>ask simple questions</b> to find out more.</p>	<p>Listen to the <b>views and responses</b> of peers.</p>	<p>Use <b>Standard English sentence structure</b> for formal conversation.</p>	<p><b>Recognise</b> how people vary their speech in different situations.</p>
